The Bridegroom's friend, and then the Groom; His end - less cry is heard:




By your sin - cere and con - stant pray'r, Raise my soul to the Lord,

Re - pent, O peo - ple, change your ways, The Bridegroom will ap - pear!




Put out the flames of pas - sion's fire That Christ be e'er a - dored.

### Troparion of the Nativity of the Forerunner - *Tone 4*




Proph-et and fore-run-ner of the com-ing of Christ, al-though we honor you with

**Kontakion of the Forerunner - Tone 3**




To - day she who once was barren gives birth to Christ's fore-run - ner. He him-self
