

Vespers Propers on the Evening of the Second Sunday of the Great Fast March 16, 2014

I cry to you, O Lord.


I have said: "You are my refuge, all I have in the land of *the* living."

Listen, then, to my cry


for I am in the depths of distress.

Rescue me from those who pursue me


