

**Vespers and Divine Liturgy Propers, Evening of March 25, 2014**  
**Tuesday in the Fourth Week of the Great Fast**

**THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE THEOTOKOS AND EVER-VIRGIN MARY** when, in the city of Nazareth, the angel of the Lord announced to Mary, "Behold, you will conceive and bear a son, and he will be called the Son of the Most High." Mary said: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And thus the fullness of time was accomplished, and he who before time was the only-begotten Son of God was made flesh for our sake and for our salvation, by the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became human.



vir - gin? Heav - en is his throne, the earth is his foot - stool, and in a  
wom-an's womb he is con-tained. The six - winged seraphim and the many-eyed  
cherubim cannot look up - on him; yet, with a single word, he has been pleased to  
take on flesh. He re-mains the Word of God. Why do I stand still and  
not say to the Maid - en: Re - joice, Full of Grace, the Lord is with you;  
Re - joice, pure Vir - gin; re - joice, Un - wed - ded Bride; re - joice, Moth - er of Life;  
bless-ed is the fruit of your womb?

**Prokeimenon of the Annunciation - Tone 4 (Psalm 95:2,1):**
