Vesper Propers, August 3, 2014 Eighth Sunday after Pentecost



His only son, Faustus, entered with him. Dalmatus followed Isaac as hegumen of the monastery, and took part in the Third Ecumenical Council (431), battling against the Nestorian heresy. (5th century)




