Fifth Sunday after Pentecost



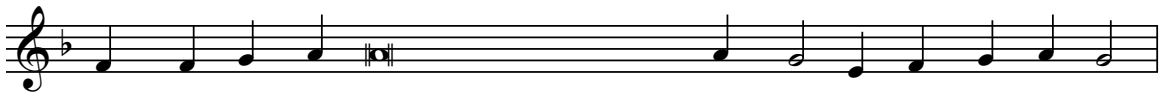
