

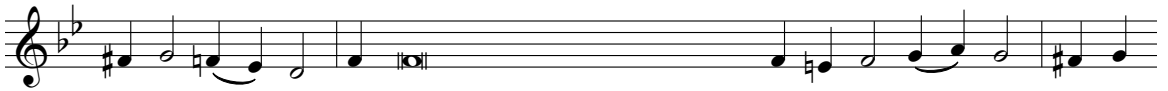

faith - ful - ly com - plete the Fast.

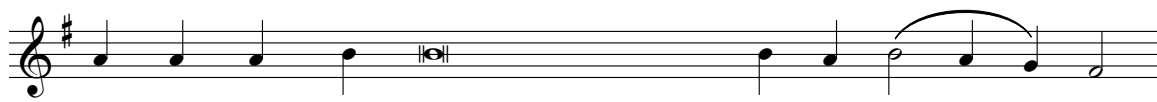

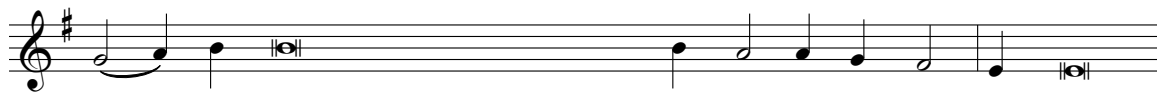
