Foreword

A Menaion is a liturgical book which contains the changeable parts of Byzantine divine services for a given month. The volume in your hands is the eighth of a series of twelve books for use in Byzantine Catholic parishes. Each day is provided with the following material:

- (1) Synaxarion (brief life of the saints remembered)
- (2) Troparia and Kontakia
- (3) Prokeimena and Alleluiaria
- (4) Communion Hymn.

On major feasts, the proper antiphons (when there are any) and the Magnification and Irmos (appointed to take the place of It is truly proper) are also included.

Texts which are contained in the Faithful's Book published by the Byzantine Catholic Church are reproduced with their musical settings from that book. Those texts were translated by the Inter-Eparchial Liturgical Commission, and then set to plainchant by the Inter-Eparchial Music Commission.

Many of the Troparia contained in this volume of the Menaion are, in fact, common texts (i.e., they are used on more than one feast). These texts, too, come from the work of the IELC/IEMC, as are all the Prokeimena and Alleluiaria and Communion Hymns.

The texts of the Troparia and Kontakia that are not from the above-mentioned source are almost always taken from the Order of Matins published by the Sisters of the Order of Saint Basil the Great, and we acknowledge these texts with gratitude.



Our holy father Nicholas Charnetsky, martyr-bishop, was born 1884 in Galicia. Gifted as a spiritual director and seminary professor, he became a Redemptorist. In 1926, he was made Apostolic Visitator to Ukrainian Catholics in Volyn and Polissya, and in 1931 he was consecrated bishop. He was arrested in 1945 by the Soviets, sent to Siberia for forced labor, and eventually returned to L'viw. (1959)






8 The holy apostles Herodian, Agabus, Rufus, Asyncritus, Phlegon and Hermes.

These were all among the Seventy, and are mentioned by St. Paul in his epistles. Herodion was a kinsman of Paul: "Salute Herodion my kinsman," he writes to the Romans (16:11). Herodion helped the Apostle Peter in Rome, and was beheaded along with many other Christians the day that St. Peter was crucified. Agabus had a spirit of prophecy; two of his prophecies are recorded in the Acts of the Apostles (11:28 and 21:11). Rufus was bishop of Thebes in Greece; he also is mentioned by Paul: "Salute Rufus, chosen in the Lord." (Rom. 16:13). St. Asyncritus (Rom. 16:14) was bishop of Hyrcania in Asia. Phlegon, who is mentioned in the same place as Rufus, was bishop in the Thracian city of Marathon. Hermas, mentioned with the others, was bishop in Dalmatia.







14 Our holy father and confessor Martin, pope of Rome, who condemned the heresy of the Monothelites at the Lateran Synod. By the order of the emperor Constans II, an assault was made on the Lateran basilica by the exarch Theodore Kalliopes to capture him. Martin was removed from his See and taken to Constantinople, where he lay in a penitentiary in most strict confinement. From there he was sent to Kherson, where, after about two years, he reached the end of his tribulations and gained his eternal crown. (665) The holy new martyrs Anthony, John, and Eustathius, who died in the city of Vilna, Lithuania. They were slaves who were baptized by a Christian priest. When this was discovered, they were hanged from a great oak tree. This oak tree was cut down and a church dedicated to the Holy Trinity was built on the site. The stump of the tree became the Holy Table. (1342)



Aristarchus was bishop of Apamea in Syria, and mentioned by Paul several times in his epistles (Acts 19:29; Col. 4:10; Philemon v.24). Paul calls him "my fellow-prisoner" and "my fellow-laborer." Pudens was an important Roman citizen. Paul mentions him once (II Tim. 4:21). Trophimus was an Asian (Acts 20:4) who accompanied Paul on his journeys. In one place, Paul laments, "Trophimus have I left at Miletum, sick." (II Tim. 4:21) They died during the persecutions of the emperor Nero.

First he was tormented in a prison workhouse for a while with a hundred other companions from among bishops, priests, and other orders of clergy. Then, on the Friday of the Passion of our Lord, all of them were slain by the sword before the eyes of Simeon, who ardently encouraged each one. Finally he himself was beheaded. (c. 341)

He was zealous for his people and a famous and effective preacher. (c.1182)


