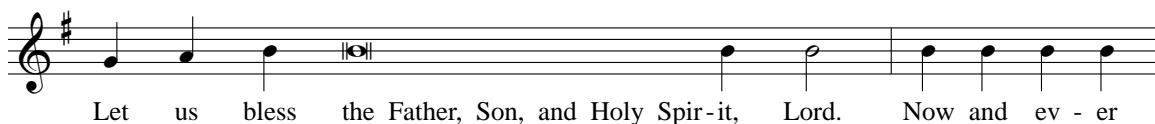
Refrain

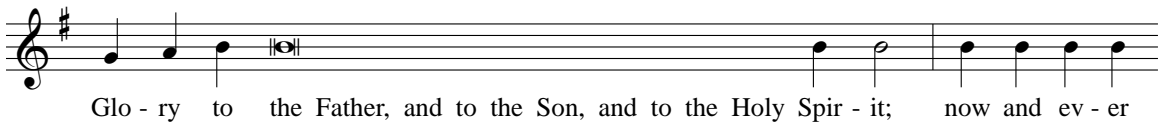


Glo - ry to you, our God, glo - ry to you.


