(on 6) But with you is found forgiveness: for this we revere you.




When the Jor - dan River re - ceived you, O Foun - tain - head, the

(on 4) and Israel on the Lord.



(on 3) Israel indeed he will redeem from all its iniquity.









a bright star, O ven-er - a - ble one, glit-ter-ing with the rays of your good deeds.





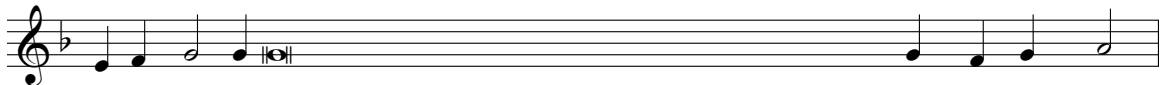
