The Bridegroom's friend, and then the Groom; his end - less cry is heard:




By your sin - cere and con - stant pray'r, raise my soul to the Lord,

Re - pent, O peo - ple, change your ways, the Bridegroom will ap - pear!




Put out the flames of pas - sion's fire that Christ be e'er a - dored.


**Kontakion of the Baptist - Tone 2**

**Alleluia - Tone 4** (Psalm 91:13,14):




