

Vesper Propers, November 15, 2009
Twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost

The holy martyrs and confessors Gurias, Samonas, and Habib. Gurias, ascetic, and Samonas suffered at Edessa in Osrhoene. They were condemned to death under Diocletian the emperor by the prefect Mysian after lengthy and savage torture and then were beheaded by the sword. Habib was a deacon who suffered for the faith later. (322)
