

Divine Liturgy, July 20, 2014 SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Troparion of the Resurrection - Tone 5




Troparion of the holy prophet Elijah - *Tone 4:*






Kontakion of the holy prophet Elijah - Tone 2:




Prokeimenon of the Resurrection - *Tone 5* (Psalm 11:8,2):
