


Immediately after the opening blessing, the following is sung once by the priest and then twice by the faithful:



Troparion of the Sunday of the Myrrh-bearers - Tone 2:

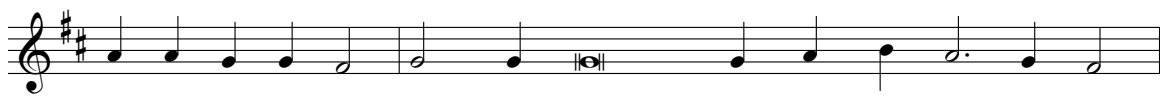


The no - ble Joseph took down your most pure bod - y from the cross.

sac - ri - fice to God. There - fore, you received a crown of vic - to - ry,



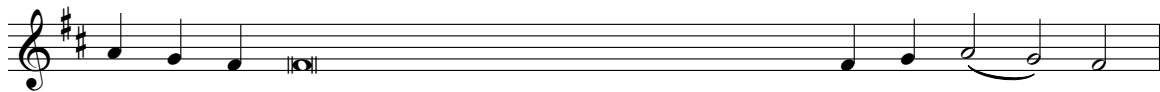
and through your pray'rs, O ho - ly one, you obtain for-give - ness of sins for all.

You fought to the shed - ding of your blood, and through your pray'rs, O ho - ly one,





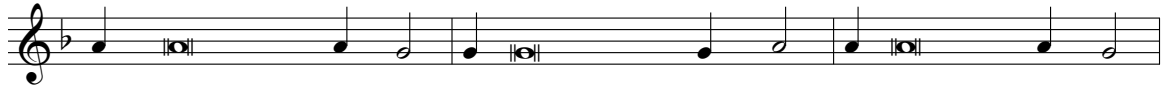

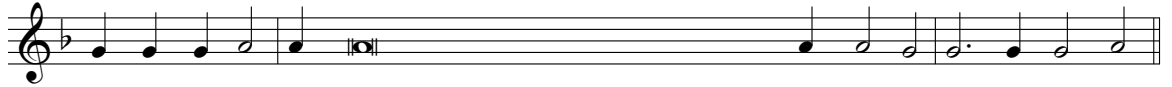
