

Divine Liturgy, November 13, 2022 TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



When he was recalled from his exile by a decree of Pope Saint Innocent I, having suffered many evils from the accompanying soldiers, he returned his soul to God on the fourteenth day of September at Comana. 






Prokeimenon of the Resurrection - *Tone* 6 (Psalm 27:9,1):




Verse: To you, O Lord, I cry out: My God, be not silent to me. *and then immediately:*

Prokeimenon of a hierarch - *Tone 1* (Psalm 48:4):




Alleluia of the Resurrection - *Tone* 6 (Psalm 90:1,2):
