


Troparia of the Resurrection - *Tone 2:*











Kontakion of the holy great martyr George - Tone 4:






Kontakion of the Holy Myrrh-bearers - Tone 2:




Prokeimenon of the Myrrh-bearers - *Tone* 6 (Psalm 27:9,1):

Alleluia of the holy great-martyr George - Tone 4 (Psalm 91:13,14):




Verse: The just man will flourish like the palm tree and grow like a cedar of Lebanon.





Communion Hymn of Pascha: (music found on page 168-169)


Receive the body of Christ; drink the source of immortality. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
