

Divine Liturgy Propers, April 30, 2023 SUNDAY OF THE PARALYTIC Fourth Paschal Sunday

The holy apostle James, brother of John the Theologian. He was the son of Zebedee and, with Peter and John, was a witness of the Transfiguration of the Lord and of his agony. Beheaded at the feast of the Passover by Herod Agrippa, he was the first of the Apostles to receive the crown of martyrdom.


Immediately after the opening blessing, the following is sung once by the priest and then twice by the faithful:





Troparion of the holy apostle James - *Tone 3:*




Kontakion of the holy apostle James - $Tone\ 2$






Kontakion of the Paralytic - *Tone 3:*




Communion Hymn of Pascha: (music found on page 168-169)

Receive the body of Christ; drink the source of immortality. Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!


Communion Hymn of Sunday (Psalm 148:1): (music found on pages 78-81)
