
Vesper Propers Thomas Sunday Second Paschal Sunday

Psalm 140 - Tone 1 samohlasen

I cry to you, O Lord.


I have said: "You are my refuge, all I have in the land of *the* living."

Listen, then, to my cry for I am in the depths of *distress*.


Rescue me from those who pursue me for they are stronger *than* I.


Cantor: (on 10)

which were pierced by nails. How won-derful is this doubt of Thom - as!




It brought the hearts of believers to the knowl-edge of God. There-fore he cried out

Cantor: (*Tone 6*) Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Now and ever and forever. Amen.


