


As you promised your disciples in earlier days, O Christ the Lover of us all, you sent your comforting Spirit; thus you made his light shine over the world.




That which was formerly announced by the Law and the prophets is fulfilled today; for the grace of the Spirit reasts on each of the faithful












While the apostles were preaching the marvels of God, the unbelievers took for drunkenness the power of the Spirit who made known to us the Trinity, the one God of our Fathers!

Glory...now and ever...


